JUSTICE FOR REFUGEES UCA PETITION CLOSE NAURU DETENTION CENTRE!

The UCA is renewing its call for the immediate closure of the Nauru detention centre after another damning report into the centre's operations. President of the UCA Mr. Stuart McMillan said, "It is Australia's moral responsibility to ensure that asylum seeks are safe in these centres, but they are not safe. How many more reports and allegations of the abuse and sexual assault of women and children do we need before the government takes action?"

The Senate Select Committee is clear that the centre is the responsibility of our government and we cannot hide behind the excuse that it is Nauru's responsibility. The centre belongs to us and we are responsible for all that happens there. The UCA is asking us to support this call to close Nauru detention centre and to transfer children and families back to Australia for care and processing and to sign the formal petition to be lodged with the House of representatives Standing Committee on Petitions.

Copies of the petition are available in all three churches , so please take the time to consider signing this important document.
