## THE FIVE FINGERED PRAYER

This prayer was displayed in Ely Cathedral in England together with the recommendation that it be photographed and used in "your own homes and churches"

1. **Thumb**—Your thumb is nearest to you so represents people who are closest to you. These are your close friends and family, often the first you think about when you pray. Give thanks to God for the love of your parents, siblings, friends and classmates and ask him to protect them.
2. **Pointer**—The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, doctors and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Thank God for their skills and ask him to help them in their important work.
3. **Tall Finger**—The next finger is the tallest finger. The big people in the world need prayer too. Ask God to give wisdom and guidance to our leaders in business, government, military and police.
4. **Ring Finger**—The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak as they are ill, in trouble, live in poverty or are in pain. Pray that God will give them new strength.
5. **Little Finger**—And lastly comes our little finger; the smallest finger of all which represents our own needs. Your little finger should remind you to pray for yourself, to say thank you to God for all the good things that happen and to ask for his help if something is difficult.
