Recent email from the Geoff and Carol Naylor Sent Saturday July the 16th

"Hello Dianne,

Thanks so much for your kind email. It was at times a pretty uncomfortable and gruelling journey on the JNC....

We are up in Hughenden, QLD tonight having driven up through inland NSW and QLD. Cobar. Lightening Ridge, Roma, Longreach. We are now heading to Townsville and some warmer weather we hope. we had ice on the car windscreen one morning—very chilly but today we wore shorts and t-shirts for the first time so life is looking up! It has been so wet up here that the outback scenery is quite unusually green. We saw dinosaur footprints at Winton yesterday, so are learning a lot.

There is a bit of a plaque of grey nomads up here! One caravan site in Longridge had 400 caravans—caravan city. I found an outback drum kit which made my day. Sadly due to its size I can't bring it home and play it in church!!

### "An opportunity to grow in our diversity"

The 2021 Census has revealed Australia is more culturally and religious diverse than ever. For the first time, first and second generation migrants make up more that half the Australian population.

The data released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics showed that:

27.6 % of the population were born overseas

Top 5 languages used at home, other than English were Mandarin (2.7%), Arabic (1.4%), Vietnamese 1.3%)
Cantonese (1.2%) and Punjabi (0.9%)

Top 5 ancestries were English (33%), Australian (29.9%), Irish (9.5%), Scottish (8.6%) and Chinese (5.5%)

Top 5 religious affiliations were No religion (38.9%), Catholic 20%), Anglican (9.85), Islam 3.2%) and Hinduism (2.7%)

The communities we live in are growing in diversity. Our neighbourhoods are made up of people of different cultures, languages and belief systems.

These changes have important implications for how we understand our identity and how we live out our life as the Uniting Church in Australia.

Nearly 40 years ago, the Uniting Church recognised and embraced its culturally diverse communities when in 1985 we declared "We are a Multicultural Church."

As our wider community becomes more diverse, so do our faith communities.

There are many emerging, vibrant and growing culturally and linguistically diverse communities across our synods. This is something we should celebrate.
