

May those of us who preach and teach in the Year of Mark lead people to meet this irresistible Christ who reaches out to each of us through the pages of Scripture!

'The Christ that emerges from Mark, trampling through the haphazard events of His life, had a ringing intensity about Him that I could not resist. Christ spoke to me through His isolation, through the burden of His death, through His rage at the mundane, through His sorrow.' (*Revelations*, Canongate Books, 2006)

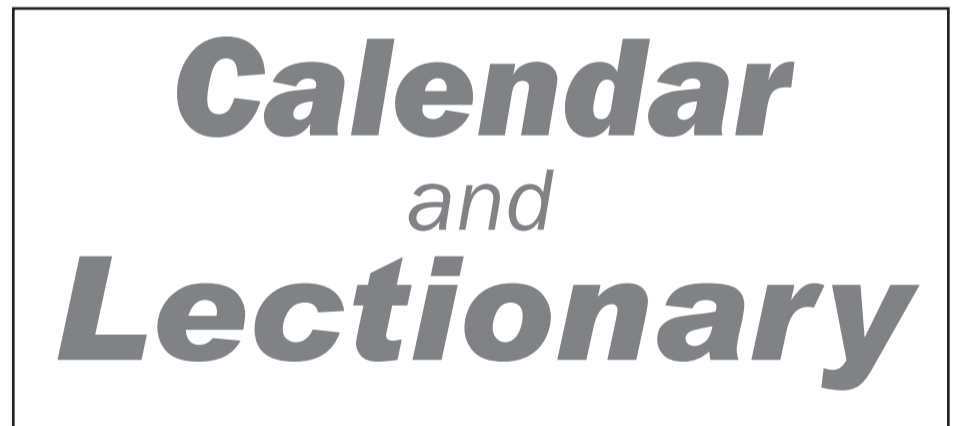
Along the way, Mark treats us to the most succinct and the most urgent telling of the stories of Jesus, perhaps the reason that this gospel is often recommended to new readers. One such new reader was the Australian-born singer Nick Cave, who later wrote an introduction to the gospel of Mark, in which he had this to say:

This year, Year B of the Lectionary cycle, is focussed for the gospel readings on the Gospel according to Mark, interestingly, the only one of the four gospels to use that designation of itself (see Mark 1:1). Mark is also the gospel most scholars agree was probably the first written and was known to and used as a starting point for the work of the writers of the other two synoptics. So, preachers this year have the opportunity to help worshippers engage with the framework of the story of Jesus that undergirds all three of the synoptic gospels – a focus on Jesus' ministry in Galilee and the north, a critical turning point with Peter's great declaration, 'You are the Christ,' Jesus' predictions of his death and the story of the Transfiguration), then the journey to Jerusalem, the events of the Passion week and Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Lectionary itself is structured around the four books of the Bible given the label of 'gospels,' with each year of the three-year cycle focussed on one of the three synoptic gospels – Matthew, Mark and Luke – and readings from John's gospel spread throughout all three years, especially on the special days and times within the Church's calendar. This format makes sense, as the synoptic gospels share a common way of telling the story of Jesus, which we can thus work our way through in each of the three years of the Cycle, whereas John's gospel adds some quite different ways of telling the stories of Jesus' ministry, passion, death and resurrection.

The Uniting Church's Basis of Union tells us that 'The Uniting Church lays upon its members the serious duty of reading the Scriptures, commits its ministers to preach from these and to administer the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper as effective signs of the Gospel set forth in the Scriptures.' As such, the element of our corporate worship services where we open the Bible and engage with the Word is a critical component of our discipleship. For that reason, a tool for ensuring we engage with a full diet of different parts of the Scriptures is incredibly helpful, and that is exactly what we have in the Lectionary. The quote from the Basis also points to what we receive from engagement with both Word and sacrament, and that is 'Gospel' – good news.

How are Sundays identified in this table?

Sundays and other days which are special "Feast Days" are simply identified by their name (eg. Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Christ the King). Otherwise, Sundays are identified by the number of Sundays after the start of a Season (Epiphany 2, Easter 3, Pentecost 16). It is important to note that sometimes one of the Sundays after a Season starts has its own name but it is still counted for the purposes of counting Sundays in that season (eg. Pentecost 1 is named Trinity Sunday, but it is also the first Sunday after Pentecost, so the next Sunday is Pentecost 2). A long standing practice in some Christian traditions counts all the Sundays which are not in a special season (ie. those after Epiphany and after Pentecost). This count of Sundays in "Ordinary Time" (from the same root word as "ordinal" thus meaning "counted time") varies depending on when Easter lands in the year. We indicate this number in brackets in case it is useful in reading lectionary resources from traditions who identify Sundays in Ordinary Time.

LENT

During the forty weekdays and six Sundays in Lent, the church remembers the life and ministry of Jesus and renews its commitment to him in Christian discipleship. The season is the traditional time to prepare for baptisms and confirmations to be celebrated at the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday, or during the season of Easter.
